 - b. **Leadership:** Supporting programmes that integrate a critical climate lens into political leadership development, strengthening ethical communication, policy design, implementation, and coalition-building, including building pipelines for leaders from underrepresented backgrounds.
 - c. **Cross-Sector Leadership:** Backing leadership on the issues climate touches most directly (energy, housing, transport, food, security, health, conservation) and reforming the political systems and institutions so leaders and new ideas in these areas can succeed.
